### 1. Welcome, Call to Order

Tom Carr, Studies Subcommittee (StS) Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m. MT on August 21, 2023. A quorum was present to conduct business. A list of attendees is attached as Exhibit A.

## 2. Review WECC Antitrust Policy

Amanda Sargent, Senior Resource Adequacy Analyst, read aloud the WECC Antitrust Policy statement. The meeting agenda included a link to the posted policy.

# 6. Future Study Program

Jon Jensen, Engineer Reliability Modeling, presented on the studies program and future restructuring of the program. Mr. Jensen briefly discussed the creation of new advisory groups as the new studies are decided upon.



### 7. PTF Recommendations Next Steps

Mr. Carr provided an update of the development of Path Task Force (PTF) advisory subgroup. This advisory group is being developed as a recommendation from the PTF Report that was published in January, 2023.

## 8. TPL-001-4 Extreme Contingencies Study Data

Evan Paull, Staff Engineer, Operations Analysis presented the TPL-001-4 extreme contingencies study data. This study assesses the resiliency of the Western Interconnection by looking at entities' TPL-001 contingencies. TPL transmission planning contingencies are reviewed and tracked over time. Mr. Paull reached out to entities for feedback on these contingencies.

## 9. UFLSWG Update

Robby Anderst, Puget Sound Energy, provided an update on the 2023 Under Frequency Load Shedding Work Group (UFLSWG) assessments. This assessment is completed every two years. WECC has a list of interested entities willing to participate in the assessment simulations. The UFLSWG meets the second Tuesday of each month.

Mr. Anderst will provide a more conclusive update at the next UFLSWG meeting.

# 10. 2023 Study Program Update

Mr. Jensen presented on the Year 10 Extreme Cold Event study assessment. The project identified vulnerabilities during an extreme cold weather event and recommended mitigation techniques. The presentation is posted on the WECC website.

Ms. Sargent presented on the Year 20 Extreme Heat/LDES Event study assessment and discussed hot weather events during August 2020, June 2021, and July 2023.

Mr. Jensen presented on the Year 20 Extreme Cold/LDES study assessment and the assessment assumptions.

Katie Rogers, Senior Engineer, Reliability Assessments, presented on the Year 20 Compound Load Impacts (CLI) study assessment. Mrs. Rogers discussed the proposed CLI timeline and reported that assumptions are reasonable for the future 2042 scenario.

Doug Tucker, Senior Engineer, Reliability Assessments, provided an update on the Grid-Forming Inverters study assessment. Mr. Tucker highlighted the reliability questions the study is attempting to address, the cases used, models and data, approach, observations, and



recommendations. This report will be available in October 2023. The presentation is posted on the WECC website.

Tyson Niemann, Staff Engineer, Reliability Modeling, discussed the study assessment on changes in grid strength. Mr. Niemann has been working with base cases modeled in simulation software, Aspen, which has not been done before.
