

# Interchange Scheduling and Accounting Subcommittee

DRAFT Meeting Minutes February 15-16, 2023 Salt Lake City, UT

### 1. Welcome, Call to Order

John Fulkerson, Interchange Scheduling and Account Subcommittee (ISAS) Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:01 p.m. MT on February 15, 2023. A quorum was present to conduct business. A list of attendees is attached as Exhibit A.

### 2. Review WECC Antitrust Policy

Layne Brown, Reliability and Market Interface Consultant, read aloud the WECC Antitrust Policy statement. The meeting agenda included a link to the posted policy.

# 3. Approve Agenda

Mr. Fulkerson introduced the proposed meeting agenda.

By consensus, the ISAS approved the agenda.

# 4. Review and Approve Previous Meeting Minutes

Mr. Fulkerson introduced the minutes from the meeting on October 17, 2022.

#### 5. Review Previous Action Items

Maddy Eberhard, Administrative Coordinator, reviewed action items carried over from the ISAS meeting on October 17, 2022. Action items that are not closed and will be carried forward can be found here.

# 6. Market Updates

Mr. Fulkerson provided an update on the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) day-ahead market enhancements (DAME) and extended day-ahead market (EDAM). Several stakeholders were involved in drafting the final proposal, which was approved on February 1, 2023. The next steps may include CAISO creating the tariff. After filing in June, a possible golive date would be late 2024 or early 2025.



Ryan Roy, Western Power Pool (WPP), presented an update for the Western Resource Adequacy Program (WRAP). The subcommittee discussed how to determine the peak amount of program capacity and deliverability of firm load.

Carrie Simpson, Southwest Power Pool (SPP), provided an update for SPP Markets+. Funding needed for Phase 1 will be \$9.7 million. Phase 1 will establish working groups and governance processes. Implementation of the market function will occur in Phase 2. The group discussed potential issues with seams and the timeline of this project, including Phase 1 kick-off and estimated go-live date of 2026. Ms. Simpson also informed the group all meetings are open and public.

## 7. ISAS and ATFWG Status Update and JGC Decision

Mr. Fulkerson provided an update on the Joint Guidance Committee (JGC) decision about merging the ISAS and After-the-Fact Work Group (ATFWG). The ISAS and ATFWG met with the JGC to discuss questions and concerns. Currently, the groups will remain separate, but the recommendation is to merge.

The subcommittee discussed the ISAS and ATFWG responsibilities from their respective charters as well as how voting might work. Mutually beneficial information sharing was also discussed as a positive outcome of merging groups.

Mr. Brown presented a draft scope of the potentially combined groups, which continued to be discussed. There was also a suggestion to include the WECC Interchange Tool (WIT) in the combined group responsibilities.

#### 8. 2024 Pre-schedule Calendar

Sam Adams, Tri-State Generation and Transmission Association (TSGT), presented the preschedule calendars for discussion. Minor changes were made to accurately reflect the 2024 and 2025 calendars.

# 9. WITWG and WIT WebSmartScheduler Update

Kokou Agbassekou, CAISO, presented an update on the WIT Working Group (WITWG) and WIT WebSmartScheduler (WIT SS) changes.

### 10. NAESB Update

Mike Steigerwald, Bonneville Power Administration (BPA), presented an update on the NAESB Wholesale Electric Quadrant. Mr. Steigerwald reviewed the status of standards in development on the 2023 Annual Plan and answered questions about curtailment.

Yuri Herrera, Turlock Irrigation District (TID), presented an update on the ATFWG. Ms. Herrera specified that four ATFWG documents on WECC's website are being consolidated, and she encouraged the group to help with this.

# 12. 2023 Scheduler's Meeting Update

Mr. Adams provided an update for the 2023 Scheduler's Meeting in May. It will be held in person once a location is confirmed. Planned presentations include gas topics, market information updates, extreme weather compliance, and MOD-030 transition. Training for NERC Continuing Education Hours will also be available.

#### 13. Public Comment

Mr. Fulkerson discussed holding in-person subcommittee meetings in the future and encouraged the members to attend. The subcommittee discussed having one in-person meeting per year with the remaining meetings held virtually. Locations were suggested for the 2023 Scheduler's Meeting for May.

The subcommittee discussed how to align power and gas days and which group creates the gas scheduling calendar.

The group also discussed the term "WECC Reserve Responsible Entity" and whether it is still relevant. It was discontinued in 2014 and is no longer applicable.
