“A good compliance program addresses and processes noncompliance quickly and effectively, but a great compliance program is able to prevent noncompliance from happening at all.”

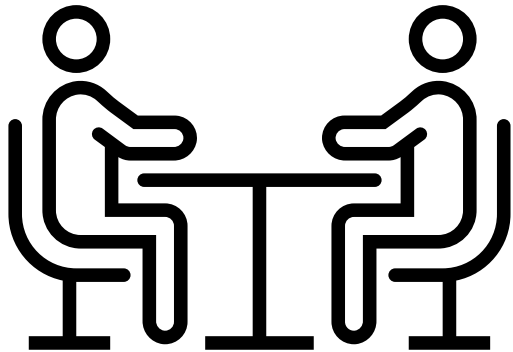

What is the WECC Self-Logging Program?

Opportunity for WECC to lean into its role as the regulator to work with stakeholders and the industry to promote reliability of the grid in the Western Interconnection.

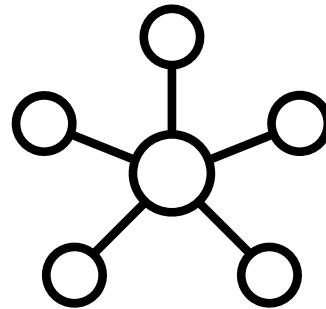
Opportunity for Registered Entities to improve their programs, allocate resources, and prevent/mitigate risks.

Affects not only Enforcement & Mitigation activities but informs others beyond Primary Compliance Contacts (PCC), such as WECC Audit Team Leads (ATL) who can improve their procedures/processes to those specific Registered Entities.

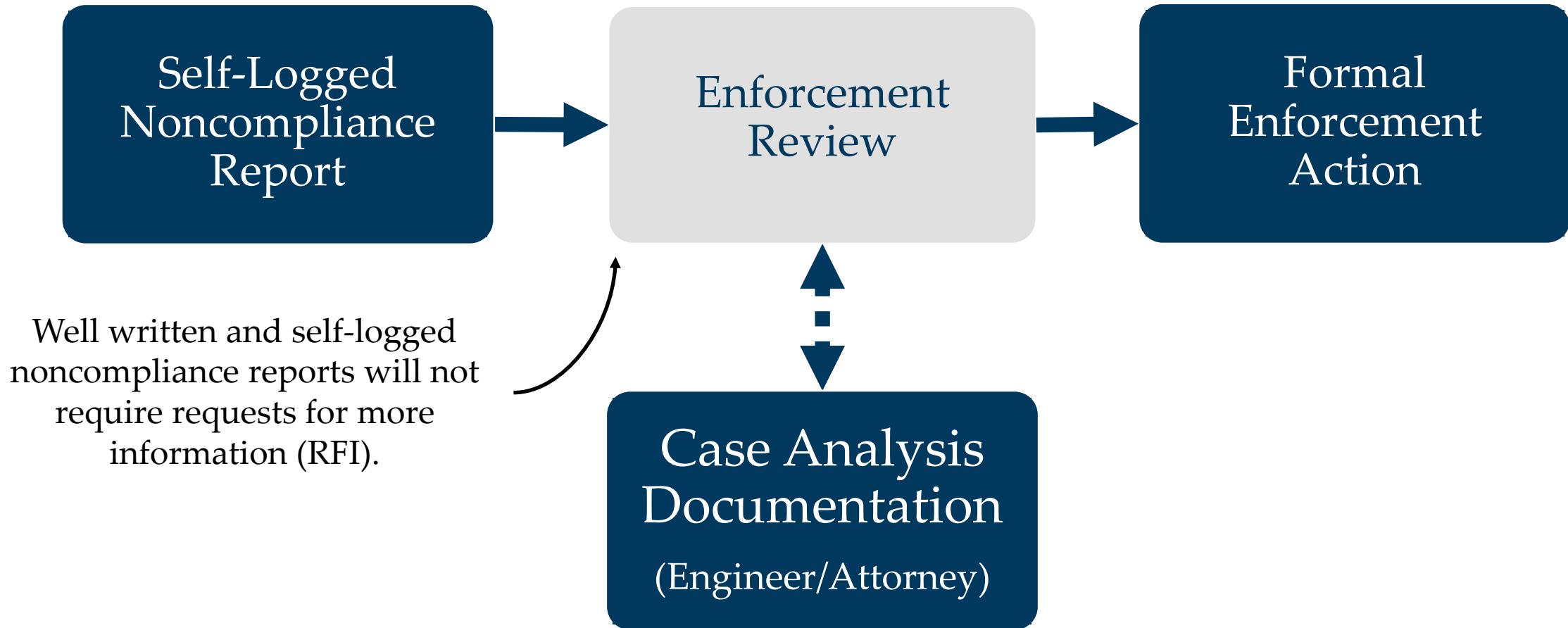

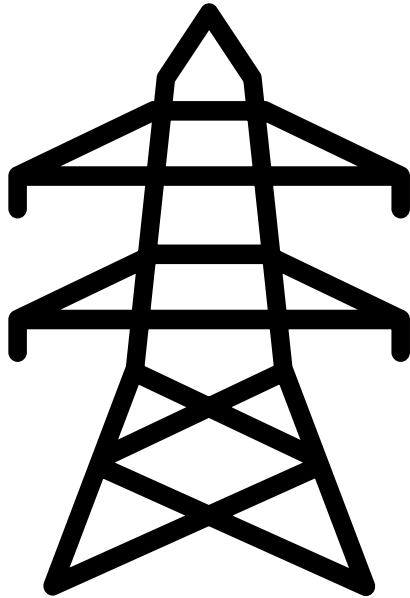

Myths Regarding the Self-Logging Program

A Registered Entity needs PCCs, a fully mature compliance program, robust internal controls, etc. to apply for Self-Logging.



WECC evaluates the ability to identify, assess, and correct noncompliances through eligibility criteria.

Registered Entities should only apply if they are sure of acceptance.



Self-Logging is an opportunity and provides tools for improvement.

Note: Entities should perform their own internal assessment against relevant criteria before applying, rather than waiting for WECC to identify and address issues.

Don't wait for feedback, but proactively tackle problematic areas—nobody knows your program like you do!

Applying for Self-Logging is resource intensive.

 - Successful Registered Entities are expected to develop working relationships with WECC; more efficiently detect, submit, and process PNCs; and move toward a more reliable and secure electric grid in the Western Interconnection
