Western Renewable Energy Generation Information System (WREGIS)

- **Overview**—An independent, web-based renewable energy registry and tracking system
 - Receives data on renewable energy generation
 - Creates Renewable Energy Certificates (REC)
 - Tracks their creation, transfers, and retirements
- **Coverage Area**—Serves the Western Interconnection and additional regions per state and provincial laws
- **Operations Model**—Functions like a banking system for certificates; WREGIS provides information and documentation to enable verification of compliance with policies and support of green power markets
- **Goals**—Ensure accurate certificates, prevent double counting, and maintain policy neutrality regarding eligibility for programs
- **Customer Registration**—Users must register as customers within WREGIS to use its services

WECC and CleanCounts Agreement

- **Overview of the Current Agreement**
 - WECC and CleanCounts (f/k/a M-RETS) have an agreement for software services supporting WREGIS, the web-based REC tracking system for the West
- **Expiration Date**
 - Agreement ends on December 31, 2027; CleanCounts has chosen not to extend
- **Opportunity for WREGIS**
 - The expiration prompts reevaluation of WREGIS's future and how to enhance its service to users and programs

Path Forward for WREGIS

- **Consultant Engagement and Recommendations**
 - A consultant was retained to consider potential paths forward for WREGIS, providing independent recommendations to management, which were presented to the WECC Board of Directors (Board) in June
- **Board Direction**
 - **Request for Proposal**
 - Issue an RFP to third-party software developers for a custom software solution
 - **Explore Separation from WECC**
 - Conduct outreach and solicit stakeholder feedback on corporate structure and governance to establish WREGIS as a stand-alone company
 - **Key Considerations**
 - Complexity of software customization and implementation risks of existing software solutions
 - WREGIS is WECC's only non-statutory program
 - WREGIS as a stand-alone company enables a focused approach to user needs

Summary of Recommended Structure and Governance

501(c)4 Nonprofit Corporation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nonprofit structure allows WREGIS to be 100% mission driven • Fits with WREGIS's focus on serving renewables generators and state and provincial renewables programs • Provides greater flexibility in government interactions than other nonprofit designations
Hybrid Board	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WREGIS benefits from the industry expertise and stakeholder engagement and relationships while simultaneously benefiting from the focus on governance and fiduciary responsibilities • Diversity of views, expertise, and experience • Confidence that the organization is not being run for the benefit of one or a subset of WREGIS's stakeholders
Stakeholder Advisory Committee	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transparency into WREGIS's decision-making • Perspectives and ideas that may be otherwise missing • A sense of joint ownership of key WREGIS issues • Leverage relationships across WREGIS's stakeholder community

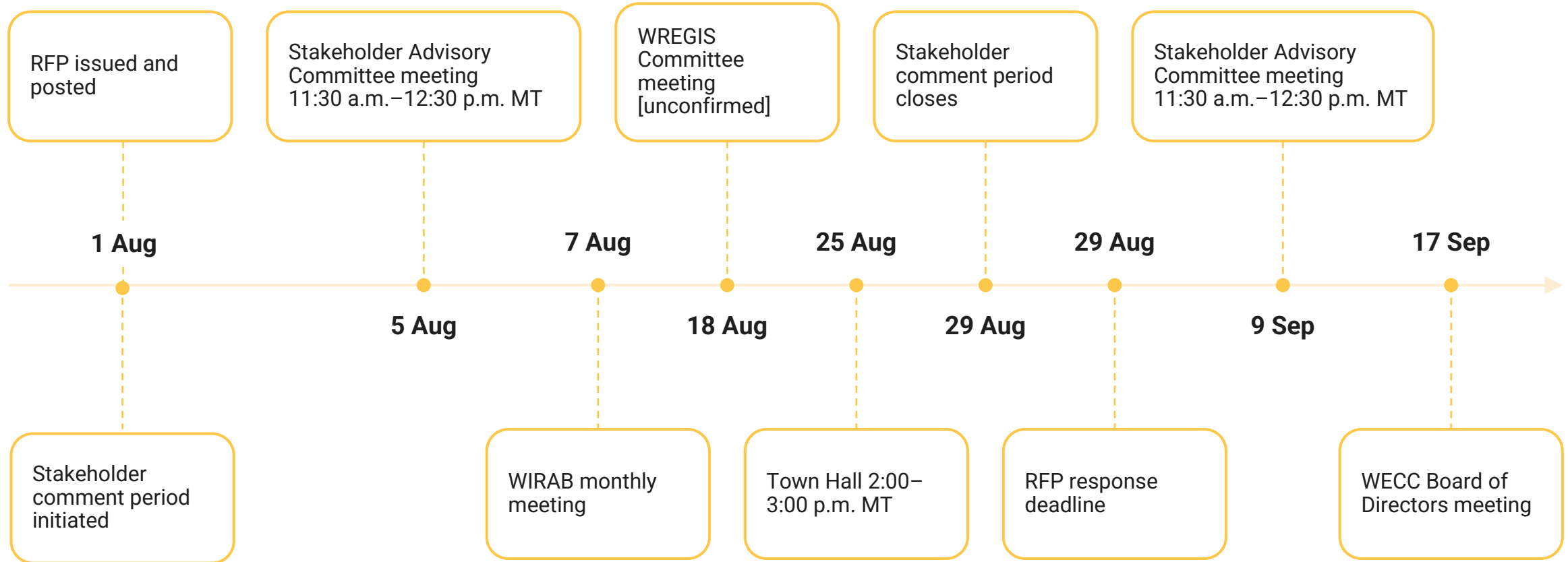
