Stephanie Little is the Manager of NERC Regulatory Affairs at Arizona Public Service Company (APS). She has been with APS for seventeen years and has spent the past eleven years on the NERC Compliance team, previously serving as a Compliance Advisor and as Manager of CIP Integration Services. In her current role, Stephanie is responsible for the implementation and oversight of the APS NERC Internal Compliance Program for both CIP and O&P. This program provides an ongoing, evolving framework for executing and ensuring compliance across the organization and establishes the expectations and requirements that underpin APS's strong culture of compliance.

Stephanie brings extensive experience with NERC Reliability Standards, with expertise in the CIP suite of standards. She has participated in three WECC audits, including leading APS's engagement during the 2025 audit, and is well versed in NERC and WECC regulatory processes such as self-reporting, self-logging, self-certification, audits, and changes to the Rules of Procedure. As the Primary Compliance Contact for APS, she has direct experience with ERO registration, CORES, and organizational certification processes.
